Lars L Gustafsson

Karolinska Institutet, Stockholm, Sweden

Professor, MD, PhD, BSc

Dr Gustafsson is a professor in Clinical Pharmacology and specialist in Clinical Pharmacology and has served many years as a senior consultant at Karolinska University Hospital in Sweden. His research interests span from the Rational Use of Medicines to tropical clinical pharmacology, pharmacogenetics, drug development and decision support. He has supervised 22 PhD students and published more than 300 scientific papers. He is committed to strengthen the role of clinical pharmacology in science, education and health services by international collaboration and mentor programs.



Katerina Tiligada

Professor, BSc, PhD

Katerina Tiligada is Professor of Experimental Pharmacology; President of the European Histamine Research Society (EHRS); and Vice Chair of the IUPHAR Immunopharmacology Section. For almost 30 years her research focuses on the investigation of inflammatory and immune-related processes, including hypersensitivity reactions, with particular interest in the role of histamine and histamine receptors in human (patho)physiology. She has established the Immunopharmacology Unit at the Department of Pharmacology, Medical School, NKUA and she coordinated for 6 years the 'Research Laboratory of Drug Allergy & Pharmacological Modification of Hypersensitivity Reactions' in the Allergy unit of the 'ATTIKON' General University Hospital in Athens. She has a long experience of teaching Medical and Dental students. She has supervised 20 PhD candidates and published more than 100 scientific articles.



Farideh Javid

PhD, Reader in Pharmacology

Dr Javid is currently a Reader in Pharmacology in Department of Pharmacy at the University of Huddersfield in the United Kingdom. Her current research is focused on Cancer Pharmacology. She is interested in identifying novel treatments for cancer patients and investigating the mechanism of action of old and new drugs originated from both the synthetic and natural sources such as cannabinoids. She has had PhD and Master students who worked on variety of cancers. She has collaboration with clinicians at the NHS hospitals and scientists at national and international levels. She is a member of two Committees at British Pharmacological Society (BPS) and the UK representative at European Association of Clinical Pharmacology and Therapy (EACPT). She has experience in working with pharmaceutical companies such as GSK, GW Pharmaceuticals and Nutraceuticals.



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
